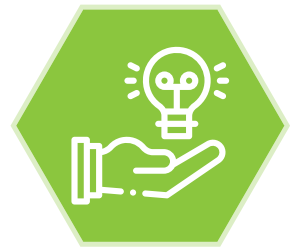

Library services are future focused and responsive to change and diversity	<p>Undertake a major strategic review of library services no later than 2024.</p> <p>Take advantage of new technology to create unique opportunities for Central Hawke's Bay as they arise.</p> <p>With the use of technology, identify opportunities to expand access to our services outside of our current opening hours.</p> <p>Grow our presence and participation in regional and national technology consortia and initiatives</p> <p>Actively seek out opportunities to pilot or try innovative and new solutions for library services in the widest sense, to be a catalyst for change and a leading library in New Zealand.</p>
Desired Result	Actions
Celebrating culture	<p>Acknowledge the special position of Māori as tangata whenua and partners under Te Tiriti o Waitangi in library services and activities, ensuring services meet the needs of Māori within the community and are adaptable as those needs change.</p> <p>Embrace our increasingly multicultural community, while recognising the importance of Tangata Whenua through increased use of Te Reo in communications and celebrating other cultures within Central Hawke's Bay.</p> <p>Ensure tangata whenua have a presence and are recognised in reimagined library spaces.</p>

Goal Two



Facilitator for discovery, innovation and lifelong learning

Where are we now?

We have begun on our journey of discovery, innovation and lifelong learning, – adopting a try, test and evaluate approach, with a ‘can-do’ attitude to opportunities as they come along.

We are working more closely with community service groups and agencies, along with other council departments to support and deliver literacy in the widest sense now to our community.

We have started to test our community’s appetite and desire for knowledge and learning - outside of the traditional perception of library, introducing opportunities for discovery such as 3D design and printing, stop motion animation, through to supporting knitting groups to reduce social isolation.

We have begun on this journey of community-initiated learning, and our community are ready and excited about the opportunities for discovery, learning and self-improvement that library services can support.

Where do we want to be?

We want people to recognise our services as the first place to access opportunities to explore and discover new skills, experiences and knowledge.

We want to support the creation of a more equitable community through partnerships and by offering services to all.

We want to support people’s ability to have intellectual freedom, to create innovative and new solutions to challenges, while supporting our community to celebrate our unique diversity.

We want to continue on our journey of exploration and discovery, identifying and creating new opportunities for our community to experience, learn and discover the unknown to reach to their potential.

We want our services to be the spark and the disruptor that creates the change in people lives from their experiences with us, to inform their future careers, social wellbeing or life fulfilment.

Strategic partnerships are leveraged to strengthen library experiences.	In conjunction with our partners, develop an annual coordinated programme calendar including – Sustainable ewe, waste minimisation, schools, U3A groups and communities, Ministry of Social Development, Early Settlers Museum, EPIC Ministries and others.
	Explore and understand how our services can support business start-up assistance in coordination with Business Hawkes Bay and our Districts Economic Development Strategy.
	Further encourage local schools to supplement their school library resources by using Central Hawke's Bay Library spaces and content and sharing knowledge about future libraries with schools.

	Expand the availability of online and digital resources.
	Update the Content and Resources Framework to ensure content continues to be relevant, culturally inclusive and reflects our diverse community now and into the future.

Where are we now?

Overall, we want our role to be recognised as key to supporting our community to Thrive.

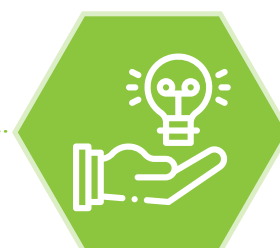


Desired Result	Actions

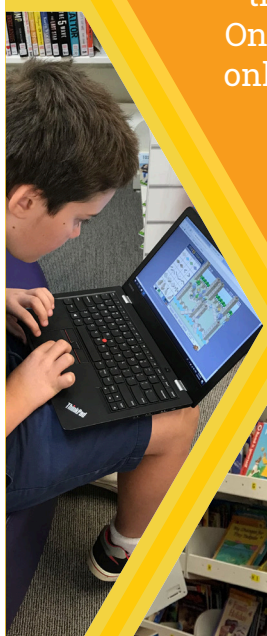
Create local connections to our local, regional and Central Government Service providers to support and ensure our community reach their full potential.
