#### 6 REPORT SECTION

#### 6.1 PROPOSED LOCAL ROADING HIERARCHY UPDATE

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this paper is to note the CHBDC Road Hierarchy system which aligns with the One Network Road Classification (ONRC). The Local Road Hierarchy presented in this paper along with the Prioritisation Criteria will help guide the Land Transport team in planning and completing all activities on the network.

#### **COMMITTEE RESOLUTION: 24.12**

That the Transport Committee notes the Road Hierarchy based on the One Network Road Classification.

Mark Kinvig and Shawn McKinley presented the road hierarchy paper, explaining its importance in determining levels of service and funding distribution. Officers highlighted the use of the ONRC framework for maintenance activities and the need for a strategic approach in retendering maintenance operations contracts.

- Questions were raised about the frequency of updates, community engagement, and the impact of traffic volumes and resilience on road classification. It was agreed that the document should be a living one, adaptable to changing needs.
- Prioritisation of Road Maintenance: The Committee discussed prioritising road maintenance, focusing on traffic volumes and community resilience for service levels. They agreed on a strategic approach for targeted investment in critical areas.
- The Committee agreed that the road hierarchy document should be dynamic, allowing updates based on community feedback and changing conditions, emphasising strategic network resilience.

## **Actions:**

- Community Engagement: Ensure that local community needs are met by engaging with local authorities and committees regarding road hierarchy and prioritisation.
- Road Hierarchy Review: The Committee raised specific concerns about road classifications and hierarchies with officers for potential adjustments.
- Elected members to pass on specific concerns about road hierarchy to Mr Kinvig, who will relay them to the land transport team.

### 6.2 LAND TRANSPORT PRIORITISATION CRITERIA UPDATE

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this paper is to provide an update on the prioritisation criteria and how it informs the maintenance interventions across the land transport network. These criteria will guide the Land Transport team in planning and completing activities on the network.

Mark Kinvig and Shawn McKinley presented the prioritization approach for maintenance and operations, seeking endorsement from the committee. He explained the criteria used for prioritization, including traffic volumes, safety, and community impact, and highlighted the importance of professional judgment in the process. Discussions noted:

- The prioritisation approach for maintenance and recovery work was discussed. This approach helps in allocating funds and resources effectively.
- Questions focused on the criteria used for prioritisation, including traffic volumes, safety, and community impact. The importance of professional judgment and strategic planning was emphasised.
- The Committee raised concerns about changes in road usage and the impact on community resilience. Officers assured that the road hierarchy document would remain a living document, allowing for adjustments based on community feedback and changing conditions

#### **Actions:**

- Traffic Count Requests: Consider conducting traffic counts in specific areas where there is community concern about changes in road usage or heavy vehicle use.
- Funding clarification: Clarify whether emergency response costs are included in the maintenance and operations cost per kilometre data.

#### 6.3 CYCLONE GABRIELLE - ROADING RECOVERY UPDATE

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the Land Transport Recovery programme and the work undertaken during September 2024.

Rebecca England and Phillip Stroud updated the Committee on the cyclone recovery program, highlighting significant progress in emergency response and recovery phase one. Ongoing discussions with NZTA regarding funding assistance rates and prioritisation of recovery phase two projects were noted. Further discussions noted:

- Cyclone Recovery Funding Clarification: Rebecca England clarified that recovery phase one is funded by Crown Infrastructure Partners, while resilience phase one is funded by NZTA. She emphasised the need for strategic prioritisation of recovery projects.
- There is a potential underspend of \$180,000 in the emergency response funded works, which may be reallocated to support other projects like Fletcher's Crossing or Wimbledon Rd.

## Actions:

- Resilience Funding: Confirm the funding assistance rate from NZT A for the recovery phase two program and communicate the decision to the council.
- Reallocation of Underspend: Land Transport Manager to decide on the allocation of the potential \$180,000 underspend in emergency response funds.
- To bring back a paper to 31 Oct Council meeting confirming the FAR rate from Waka Kotahi/NZTA.

• Community Engagement on School Bus Services: Councillors to encourage affected parents to contact their schools regarding potential changes to school bus services.
